By car

From London and the South

M11, A11. Exit A11 at Larling (B1111) and follow the road for 6 miles. Settle is on the right just before the crossroads.

From the North and Central

A134 southbound to Thetford. Exit left to Wretham on Harley's Drove, then left onto Wryler's Belt. At Wretham turn left onto A1075. Continue through Stonebridge. Exit right onto Wretham Road into Great Hockham and continue onto Shropham Road. Take the right fork onto Hockham Road and turn left onto the B1111. Settle is on the right just before the crossroads.


By train


We recommend you pre-book a local taxi for your journeys from Attleborough station to Settle and back.





Please remove your outdoor shoes inside the property and treat our space with respect.

No further guests are permitted onsite unless previously agreed.

All items inside the cabin and carriages are there for future guests to enjoy as well as you. Please do not remove anything from the property; please leave as you found.

Please use the bins provided (under sink & outside) for recycling and waste. These have been labelled for your ease of use ~ General waste / food waste / recyclables / glass.

No unscheduled photoshoots permitted.
Please contact us directly to discuss the use of the cabin or carriages for your shoot.

During your stay we ask that guests are responsible around the lakes here at Settle. You are welcome to swim in them, at your own risk.

All three lakes have life-rings, located at:
The oak tree overlooking the lake by the Cabin;
Carriage no. 1;
The viewing bench by the safari tent lake.

In cold weather the heating in your stay will be set to run automatically; there is no need for you to alter it. The only time we ask you to touch it is before you depart – please switch the heating to OFF on the handheld thermostat before you check out. If it is left on, the extra cost incurred will be deducted from your deposit.

Guests' deposits will be returned from 5 – 7 days after departure, following clearing, cleaning and processing of their accommodation by us.
